# Power In Nature, Hills For Everyone, Local and State Policymakers Announce Next Steps in Highly Anticipated 842 Acre Acquisition

Chino Hills, CA - On Friday, March 24th at 10 am, the Power In Nature Coalition and Hills For Everyone will announce alongside the California Natural Resources Agency, the Wildlife Conservation Board, Senator Kelly Seyarto, Assemblymember Phillip Chen, and City of Chino Hills Mayor Peter Rogers plans of an 842-acre acquisition adjacent to Chino Hills State Park. The goal is to complete this acquisition by the end of the year in partnership with the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority, furthering the state's efforts to protect 30% of California's lands and waters by 2030.

The 14,100 acre Chino Hills State Park lies at the juncture of four of Southern California's most populous counties: Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino, and Riverside, making it one of the most accessible state parks in California. Designed along ridgeline boundaries, visitors and wildlife are protected from the sights and sounds of urban life. However, the eastern ridgelines adjacent to the state park continue to be vulnerable to development as it remains in private ownership.

For more than 40 years, the eastern ridgelines have been envisioned for protection. Earlier phases of this effort protected 730 acres over the last few years through the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority. There is one final phase to be acquired, roughly 842 acres through a willing seller transaction.


